## *From the Cantor*

Every year when we begin the Book of Deuteronomy, usually around the end of July, beginning of August, I know that the High Holydays are not far behind. Then the weather begins to cool, and autumn is upon us in no time. During the month of Elul, which is the month before Tishrei when the High Holydays begin, traditional synagogues blow the shofar at weekday services. The unique tone and sound of the shofar were used as a form of communication and as an alarm for Jews in ancient days. Even now when Jews hear the sound of the shofar during the month of Elul and on Rosh Hashanah, it stirs something in our soul waking us from our normal way of thinking, and beckons us to take stock of ourselves. What did we do in the past year that we were not proud of? What could we do differently in the future? Can we right any wrongs?

One thing that all of us might do differently is to either donate more tzedakah to charity, or better yet, get involved and volunteer your time to causes you believe in which benefit your local community. Giving of yourself and your time can be one of the most rewarding experiences. Our Temple Sinai Social Action Committee might be able to help you to locate an area organization which might work for you. It's a great opportunity for people of all ages, even seniors. The whole community benefits when you share your time and knowledge.

A great place to volunteer within our temple is to join Temple Sinai Adult Choir. We will be participating at several services this year and may even have a sing out or two in our community. If you like to sing and to express your spirituality through music, please come and join us. You don't have to be able to read music to participate. All you need is a voice, and an eagerness to participate and learn. Benefits of choir membership are a greater knowledge of Jewish music, a better understanding of the service and its prayers, learning to read music notation, a better pronunciation of Hebrew, and meeting a new group of friends who share your love of Jewish music. We rehearse on Tuesday evenings in the sanctuary from 7:30 to 8:45 pm. Please come and join us. Our first "Welcome Back" social and first rehearsal will take place on Tuesday, September 9, 2014. Come and join us!!

Also our Junior Choir is open to all students in our religious school in grades 2 through 7. Our first informational meeting for parents and rehearsal will take place on Sunday, September 14, 2014 right after the end of religious school at 11:30 a.m. in the sanctuary. Please consider having your child join this group. They will learn how to sing harmony, learn our prayers, and strengthen their Hebrew reading and pronunciation all in a fun and exciting way. Flyers will be sent home on the first day of religious school.

During this High Holyday season, my husband Max and I, along with our two sons Kasey and Matt, would like to wish all of you a very sweet, happy and healthy Jewish New Year.

## *Hebrew Health Care—Hospice Volunteers Needed!*



NUTSY has been selected to host NFTY Northeast's Fall Conclavette the weekend of November 14-16. Members of NUTSY will host nearly 300 Jewish teens from our NFTY Northeast region at Temple Sinai in a weekend of prayer, learning and fun! The entire congregation is invited to join the NFTY Northeast community for a teen-led Friday night service on November 14th in the Temple Sinai Sanctuary. NFTY services are creative, engaging, and full of *ruach* (spirit), and are an amazing prayer opportunity for anyone who wishes to be immersed in joyful prayer and song! Throughout the remainder of the weekend, NFTY teens will participate in peer-led programs and workshops, Shabbat and Havdalah services, and a dance party on Saturday night.

Although Fall Conclavette is technically teen-hosted, NUTSY will be relying on support from our entire congregation to successfully execute such a large event! There are various ways that all Temple Sinai members can be a part of this incredible experience as a volunteer and/or as a host family. NUTSY will need your help facilitating the activities, providing and serving food; we will require adult chaperones during the dance, among other roles. The volunteer position in greatest demand will be for families to house approximately 300 teen participants on Friday and Saturday night (Nov. 14 & 15). Typically, each family that volunteers to host teens will have 3-10 teens in their home. Previous host families have found this to be a deeply enriching and meaningful experience. Teens sleep in sleeping bags on couches, floors, or beds, so please don't feel limited by the physical space of your home when considering taking on the role of a host family. If you are interested in finding out how you can be a part of this amazing event as a volunteer and/or host family, please attend our Volunteer Information Meeting on **Wednesday, September 10 at 7:30 p.m.** This meeting is open to all members of the temple! 
